

DETAILED CONDITIONS FOR GRANTING THE RECTOR'S SCHOLARSHIP FOR STUDENTS

- I. Points for scientific achievements are awarded according to the following table:
EVERY SCIENTIFIC ACHIEVEMENT (attached to the application) MUST INCLUDE a description of the student: (author's name, date and place, CODE of achievement, attachment number – consistent with the attachment on the application)

1. Points for individual scientific achievements are added up.
2. Submission of the application is tantamount to signing a statement that the data provided is factually correct. Providing false information is subject to disciplinary and criminal liability.
3. If the committee does not take into account the presented achievement, the student receives "0 points".
4. In the absence of a document confirming the achievements indicated by the student, the committee will not award points for them.
5. Only published papers are taken into account.
6. Only two popular science articles and active participation in only two university conferences in a given academic year may be considered, regardless of the language in which the articles were published and the papers delivered. A popular science article is considered to be published in non-peer-reviewed or online journals, as well as in periodicals/journals of student scientific societies. A university conference is considered to be an event organized at the University of Lodz or by a unit of the University of Lodz.
7. Active participation in the conference is considered to be the delivery of a paper or presentation of a poster. Points are awarded only once for active participation in a specific conference regardless of the number of papers delivered or posters presented.
8. A given scientific achievement is scored only 1 time in the case of delivering the same paper at multiple conferences, the highest number of points is taken into account. (type of conference).

II. Points for artistic achievements are awarded according to the following table:

- Points for individual artistic achievements are added up.
- Submission of the application is tantamount to signing a statement that the data provided is factually correct. Providing false information is subject to disciplinary and criminal liability.
- If the committee does not take into account the presented achievement, the student receives "0 points".
- In the absence of a document confirming the achievements indicated by the student, the committee will not award points for them.
- The following are considered arts: literature, music, dance, theater, cinematography, care of historical monuments, folk art, visual arts (photography, painting, sculpture, graphics), applied arts.
- A book, a volume, an album, a film, a play are considered to be published works.
- Artistic activities related to the arts, i.e. concerts, exhibitions, film screenings, as well as administrative or management functions in art groups, are not considered artistic achievements.
- A university conference / festival / review / contest is considered to be an event organized at the University of Lodz, a national one is considered to be an event organized by a Polish centre other than the University of Lodz, while an international one is considered to be an event organized by foreign centres.
- Only one achievement of a given rank should be entered in the application. If, for example, a student participated in two national art competitions, only the event at which he or she won the higher place is taken into account. Points are not added up for several artistic achievements of a given rank.

Points for sports achievements are awarded according to the following table:

1. Points for individual sports achievements are added up.
2. Submission of the application is tantamount to signing a statement that the data provided is factually correct. Providing false information is subject to disciplinary and criminal liability.
3. If the committee does not take into account the presented achievement, the student receives "0 points".
4. In the absence of a document confirming the achievements indicated by the student, the committee will not award points for them.
5. In individual sports, the position *taken* in the individual classification should be entered in the column of the place taken. The place taken by the team is not taken into account (does not apply to team sports, games).
6. Only one achievement of a given rank should be entered in the application. If, for example, a player participated in the Polish academic volleyball championships and the Polish youth volleyball championships organized by the Polish Volleyball Federation, only the event or competition in which he or she placed higher is taken into account. Points are not added up for several sports achievements of a given rank.
7. If you have a sports class, it is necessary to attach its confirmation issued by a Polish sports association listed in the current announcement of the minister responsible for physical culture. The lack of a certificate is equivalent to not taking into account the points for the sports class.

III. Points for grade point average are awarded according to the following rules:

1. Scholarship points are awarded to students with a high average for the previous year of study.
2. Points for a high average are awarded based on the average: multiplied by a factor of 10.

$$\text{points} = \text{average} * 10$$
